NOTABLE CASES:

Zachair Ltd. v. The Driggs Corp., 135 Md. App. 403 (1999). A major business tort case that included claims for conversion, tortious interference with business relations and abuse of process. In an extensive opinion, the Court of Special Appeals affirmed the trial court's authority in regard to the remittitur of punitive damages and discussed the bases for award of attorneys fees in the context of a commercial dispute.

State Highway Admin. v. Frederick Brick Works, Inc., Circuit Court for Frederick County, Maryland, Case No. 03-2835-CV (2003). A significant condemnation case where Mr. Fredrickson negotiated a final multi-million dollar award that was more than double the State's estimated property value. The final award included costs for the reconfiguration of a construction supply company's storage and operations yard. The planning of the new business configuration was coordinated with road improvements to maximize the future commercial value of the property and the potential for alternative uses of the site.

Beghtol et al. v. Earl V. Omer, et al., Circuit Court for Baltimore County, Case No. 03-C-01-008651 (2001). In a dispute between shareholders, Mr. Fredrickson successfully proved a case for significant compensatory and punitive damages that were awarded to his clients.
